BRIMINGTON is a parish, 1 mile from Sheepbridge and Brimington station on the Great Central section of the London and North Eastern railway, 2 miles north-east from Chesterfield station on the London, Midland and Scottish railway and 153 from London, in the Chesterfield division of the county, hundred of Scarsdale, rural district, petty sessional division, county court district, rural deanery and archdeaconry of Chesterfield and diocese of Derby. The village is supplied with electric light and power by the Brimington Electric Supply Co. Limited, from Staveley. The church of St. Michael, erected in 1847, is a building of stone, consisting of chancel, clerestoried nave, aisles and western tower, considerably raised in 1847, and containing a clock and 3 bells: there is a memorial to the Rev. Henry Audsley, vicar of Chesterfield (1723); at the east end of the chancel is a window to Mrs. Mills, of Tipton Grove, d. 1893, and one on the north side of the church to W. T. G. Burr esq., a former churchwarden. A memorial was erected in the church in April, 1921, to the men connected with this parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18; it stands out against the east window of the south aisle, and represents the figure of a Christian soldier; the whole of the cost was borne by R. F. Mills esq. J.P.; there are 550 sittings. The register dates from the year 1794, and there is also a copy made in 1801 of some dilapidated registers. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £400, including 10 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the vicar of Chesterfield and held

since 1935 by the Rev. Donald Dowty Macqueen. St. Mary's, a mission church on Brimington Common, was built in 1878 at a cost of £525, and has sittings for 260 persons. The Church Hall, erected in 1913, seats 350. There is a Congregational chapel, built in 1895, seating 170, also three Methodist chapels, a hall used by the Independent Holiness Movement, and other Methodist chapels at New Brimington and Brimington Common. The charities amount to from £45 to £50 yearly. There is a cemetery of 4 acres, with two chapels, laid out at a cost of £4,500 in 1878, and under the control of the Parish Council. The Staveley Coal and Iron Company Limited are the chief landowners. Gas is available. Water is supplied by the Chesterfield Rural District Council. The soil and subsoil are clay. The chief crops are wheat and oats. The area is 1,283 acres of land and inland water; the population in 1931 was 5,073.

BRUSHFIELD is a township in the parish of Bakewell, annexed to Taddington for ecclesiastical purposes, 5 miles south from Tideswell, 3 south from Millers Dale station on the Derby and Manchester section of the London, Midland and Scottish railway, and $5\frac{1}{2}$ west-north-west from Bakewell, in the Western division of the county, hundred of High Peak, rural district, petty sessional division and county court district of Bakewell; it consists of four farm houses only, and is situated between ridges of hills. There is a footpath north of the hill which leads to Tideswell

BUXTON

BUXTON is a celebrated watering place, on the river Wye, and 3 miles from the source of that river. The old road from Derby to Manchester passes through the town, which is 12 miles west-north-west from Bakewell, 22 north-west from Matlock, 24 south-south-east from Manchester, 38 north-north-west from Derby, 26 south-west from Sheffield and 159 from London by road; in 1895 it was formed into a civil parish from the parish of Bakewell, and is in the High Peak division of the county, hundred of High Peak, county court district of Buxton, Chapel-en-le-Frith and New Mills, head of a petty sessional division, in the rural deanery of Buxton, and archdeaconry and diocese of Derby. The London, Midland and Scottish railway has three stations here. The Midland section of that railway is the direct route from London via Derby, from which town there is access to the north and the eastern districts; the London and North Western section communicates via Stockport with Wales, Shropshire and the Potteries, Liverpool and Manchester and all parts of Lancashire, Ireland and the west of Scotland. The Buxton and High Peak Junction railway, an extension of the old London and North Western from Buxton to Ashbourne, affords

direct communication with the London and Crewe line at Nuneaton; near the Buxton station the line crosses the principal thoroughfare of the town and the river Wye by a stone viaduct of 15 arches, the largest of which has a width of 83 feet 9 inches, and most of the remaining arches are each of 42 feet 6 inches span; the height from the ground is about 60 feet; another viaduct of 13 arches, each of 36 feet span and about 90 feet high, crosses the Duke's Drive; the construction of the section has also necessitated the excavation of a tunnel 500 yards long and the erection of over 20 bridges. The Duke's Drive, by Wye Dale, better known as "Ashwood Dale," commands scenery of the wildest and most magnificent description, while the neighbourhood is noted for its healthy situation, and abounds with natural curiosities. The footpath by the banks of the Wye to Millers Dale affords a series of beautiful views of river scenery.

The town is situated in a deep valley, and would be completely environed with mountains and moorlands but for the deep ravine parallel to and below the road leading to Bakewell, through which the river Wye flows in its course towards the Derwent: it is 1,025 feet above the level of
